## Public Statement on Medicare Coverage of Medically Necessary Oral and Dental Health Therapies

The Consortium for Medically Necessary Oral Health Coverage is pleased to commend the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) for its regulatory action to improve the lives of millions of Medicare beneficiaries. In recent years, CMS has clarified that Medicare payment is available for dental services that are inextricably linked to and substantially related and integral to the clinical success of certain Medicare-covered medical services, including but not limited to organ transplant surgery, cardiac valve replacement, valvuloplasty procedures, and cancer treatment. Importantly, CMS also established an annual process for stakeholders to nominate additional clinical scenarios for Medicare payment, marking the first time stakeholders have been able to propose for CMS' formal consideration covered medical services for which clinical evidence demonstrates that dental care is inextricably linked and substantially related and integral to their clinical success.

Building on this progress, the 2025 Physician Fee Schedule further clarifies Medicare payment policy for dental services that are inextricably linked to the treatment of beneficiaries with End Stage Renal Disease (ESRD). Consortium members utilized the annual nominations process to urge CMS to take this action due to evidence of the nexus between dental and oral health and dialysis. As a result, the Consortium is pleased that, beginning January 2025, dental and oral examinations as well as diagnostic and treatment services to eliminate an oral or dental infection will be covered by the Medicare program for beneficiaries with ESRD.

The Consortium also wishes to express its gratitude to CMS for once again welcoming stakeholder nominations and including this payment clarification in the Physician Fee Schedule final rule. Since more than half a million Medicare beneficiaries with ESRD receive dialysis services every year, the Agency's action holds the potential of having a meaningful impact in the lives of a large population of beneficiaries and their families.

Action of this nature is critically important. While overall health is inextricably linked to oral health, dental care has long been inaccessible to millions of Medicare beneficiaries, not only increasing their risk of suffering untreated periodontal disease, but also increasing Medicare beneficiaries' risk of suffering chronic conditions such as diabetes, autoimmune disease, kidney disease, heart disease, and numerous forms of cancer, with the result being an increase in overall Medicare program costs. For this reason, the Consortium welcomes the final Medicare Physician Fee Schedule for 2025 as another meaningful step forward for Medicare beneficiaries, Medicare solvency, and oral systemic health.

"By clarifying Medicare payment of medically necessary dental care for beneficiaries with ESRD who receive dialysis treatment, CMS is continuing to make progress in improving outcomes and reducing costs," said Dr. Judith Haber on behalf of the Sante Fe Group. "We are equally pleased the Agency has expressed its commitment to exploring the inextricable link between dental and medical services and other chronic conditions, including diabetes and autoimmune disease."

"By recognizing Medicare payment of medically necessary dental care for beneficiaries who receive dialysis services to treat End-Stage Renal Disease, CMS will help ensure that more than half a million beneficiaries who receive dialysis for ESRD today will have access to the medically necessary oral care they need," agreed Jeffrey Silberzweig, MD, Chief Medical Officer of The Rogosin Institute, Professor of Clinical Medicine at Weill Cornell Medical College, Medical Director for Dialysis Services at New York-Presbyterian Hospital/Weill Cornell and Lower Manhattan Hospitals, and Co-Chair of the American Society of Nephrology's COVID-19 and Other Emerging Threats Workgroup.

"We applaud this enhanced clarification of Medicare payment policy and the progress CMS continues to make towards more equitable health care for people who rely on Medicare," said Bailey Reavis, Manager of Federal Relations for Families USA. "In this final rule, CMS has once again demonstrated its sensitivity to stakeholders' input, and its commitment to consider additional chronic diseases is very encouraging for all who seek further payment clarification in the years ahead."

"For decades, Medicare beneficiaries suffered due to a lack of access to medically necessary dental care," emphasized Center for Medicare Advocacy Co-Director David Lipschutz. "Thanks to the evidence-based action the Medicare program continues to take, we are moving closer and closer to a future of better health, improved quality of life, and greater program equity."

In support of transformative change, nearly 250 leading organizations joined as signatories of the Consortium's Community Statement to urge Congress and the Administration to explore options for extending evidence-based coverage to all Medicare beneficiaries. The Consortium will now turn to the forthcoming February 10, 2025 deadline for nominations of additional clinical criteria, and we look forward to continued consideration of Medicare payment clarification for medically necessary oral and dental services that are inextricably linked, essential, and of profound clinical, fiscal, and human value.
